Shoshone Rock Club – Powell

Yearbooks were handed out to members, which included a list of club members, BLM rockhounding rules, and a magazine subscription form for Rock & Gem. Members were asked to contact Jane Neale for the state gem show. The show set up will be on June 18th and show on Saturday and Sunday, 19th and 20th. Under new business, Greg Jones explained the stream access law/equal footing law. Basically it states that people have the right to access streams below the observable high water line for reasonable activities, fishing, rock hunting, photography, etc. Greg has put together a petition to access the streams and lakes: North Fork, South Fork, Sunlight, Clarks Fork, Shell, Greybull, Big Horn, Wood, etc. The economics involved could

bring in more tourism, with fishing being the most important. Seventy-seven (77)% of the dollars come from recreation. We are encouraged to sign the petition-Right of Stream Access-5% of voting people of each county need to sign, before the petition can be presented to the state legislature. Linna Beebe, recommended sending the petition to Chambers of Commerce. Mary Vogel can take it to Casper. Also, place the petition at the rock club show. Carl Brown mentioned the Forest Service and BLM are closing roads. Ranchers are also closing country roads. All the county has to do to get the road back is ask for it. Dues are now due. Linna showed a thank you card from the Boys and Girls club for activities on President's Day, planting flowers and gold panning. Art was presented a silver tie tack of Heart Mountain created by Jane Neale in appreciation of his service as President for 2009. Program for the evening was a video "Gemstones of America."
